Hi all,

I wanted to give you an update on some of the behind-the-scenes work taking place here at SWUU. Each board year, the board assembles for a board retreat to set goals for the upcoming year and reflect on our progress so far. This year, one of our priorities is helping our church be more visible to our community. At our last board meeting, we voted to amend our event use policy to make it more simple and transparent to those who may want to use our space, as well as more accessible to groups that align with our values who may not otherwise be able to afford it. Our board continues to brainstorm along these lines, and plans on leading a worship service next spring to do this brainstorming work together as a congregation.

In addition to this, safety and security continues to be an ongoing priority. Our safety/security team has historically brainstormed safety/security measures and taken turns monitoring the door during

services in the past. This is a conversation happening not just at our church, but at UU churches across the country as we continue to grapple with an ever-changing landscape here in the United States. As of now, our safety/security team no longer has a leader. If safety and security is something that you have on your mind lately, and you would like to be involved (as a participant or as a leader), please let me know so I can help connect you.

Another final update I want to give you is that myself, Adrienne Ellis, Eli Butler, and Deb Celinski will be helping facilitate an LGBTQ+ support group at our church on the first Tuesday of each month, beginning in January. We plan on advertising this group not just within the church but outside of SWUU as well, so our church can be a community resource. I hope that this can be a safe space for LGBTQ+ community members to find support and encouragement in each other.

I know many are feeling fear and uncertainty as we approach the new year and all the changes it will bring, but I am grateful that we have each other. I look forward to meeting all the new folks who will be finding their way to us in this upcoming year!

As we start the planning process,


