Focus Collection for January: Greater Cleveland Habitat for Humanity

SWUU has proudly supported the work of Habitat during January for many years. During that time, Habitat has added new and exciting services to their many offerings. The volunteers build new homes, renovate and upgrade efficiency of existing homes, and provide Critical Home Repair. Most recently, they found a creative way to accomplish their goals within the timelines set by Habitat and its supporters: Modular Homes!

These homes are being built elsewhere in Ohio while the foundations are being prepared in the Cleveland area neighborhoods. They have full basements and the ability to add solar power later. Each affordable home is 3-bed, 2-bath, 1350 sq. ft., and is ENERGY STAR certified. How's that for preparing for Cleveland's future?! Families partner with Habitat to contribute service hours by working with volunteers, while taking classes in finance, home maintenance, and budgeting to prepare for home ownership.
